- 1.0 The meeting was held at the Riddlesden Cricket Club; Shaun thanked the Club for hosting the meeting and the Co-op for providing food. The Partnership liked the venue and suggested that a light to be put in place outside as it's difficult to spot the place in the dark.
- 2.0 Shaun confirmed Flowers have been given to Sue as she is unwell at the moment.
- 3.0 The Partnership members chose their topics to discuss from 12 different topics titles.

Hainworthwood Community Centre Christmas tree

Permission is given to access the land adjacent to the Centre. It was suggested that a Christmas tree to be put there. Few members have said that it could be vandalised as it is located outside. The Partnership would prefer to fund a tree in the centre. The idea to utilise the land is a good one and should be explored further, once the Partnership know how much funding is available. Budgets should be confirmed within the month and how much Big Local is contributing to CLLD,

HALE Bus

£9,000 is secured for the next 3 years for the HALE Bus. The HALE Bus has visited Surrey Street, Clover Rise, Alpha Street and Red Holt and is very well used by the children and parents. There was no attendance on Parkwood Street, so this was cancelled.

Riddlesden Toad Patrol

This is on this Friday on the HALE Bus. Residents who self-organise to run the Toad Patrol in the Big Local area will meet for a celebration of achievement- saving 1700 toads and plan the next patrol in Spring 2019. 22 people have signed up, they will also be submitting an application for funding for PPE and there will be a fish and chip supper afterwards.

Keighley Business Awards 2019

This is on the last Friday in June 2019. The Partnership will have to agree a means of allocating tickets. A table for 12 is booked. France-Leigh has secured £1,000 to sponsor a Keighley Social Award and £1,000 to fund Socialight events. Funding from Unltd.

Keighley Socialights

Greg and France-Leigh form the subcommittee. Helen has expressed an interest in helping. 5 people applied and 3 people were selected for interviews. The first Green Drinks Good Business will be held next week, a means of keeping all applicants talking to each other.

QCafe

Greg is opening up the Cricket Club for the QCafe every Wednesdays for 6 weeks from 12.30-2.30pm at the Riddlesden Cricket Club. Numbers are very low. This will be reviewed again after 6 weeks for continuity. Eric Yaffey has won an award to trial the idea of a skills sharing group.

Calendar 2019

There will be a calendar with all the future activities including Keighley Business Awards, clean up days, Play Days, summer camps etc. Everyone to contribute.

Transport Festival

Meetings arranged and supported by John Grogan MP Office to arrange a transport festival in 2020. Mike has offered to represent the Partnership. This could be supported by the Unique Keighley budget

Hainworthwood Community Centre Storage Space

There is storage space at the Centre to store KBL equipment and use as a meeting room. A draft agreement has been drawn up- for £100 per month. Discussion took place on how best to operate a key holder policy. This is included in the proposed agreement along with insurance cover and an itinerary of equipment. Although the agreement sounds good there are concerns about the Centre roof. Some members have said that the Centre roof needs repairing and storing the equipment there would be too risky of damage in case the roof falls in. A vote took place regarding this.

3 members have agreed to store the equipment there and 4 members disagreed. Shaun will advise the Centre that KBL will be withdrawing the offer.

There is still a need to find accessible storage space to host the 'Library of things'; now worth £2500, all items will make it easier and cheaper to run events and activities in future years. Shaun suggested talking to Annie about getting a shipping container that would cost £800 per year. Greg said the Cricket Club could be a possibility for siting it.

Youth Services

Abina is the area manager for the Youth Services 13-19 years. She talked about how she is supporting young people in a new project called Youth and Mind Gap on at Tuesday evening 5-7pm in partnership with Dance United. The Friday night session is going very well. The Youth Service is making use of the HALE Bus at the Rec. It was suggested to encourage young people to deliver KBL leaflets, best practice guidance could be sort form the Worth Valley Magazines. Shaun to invite manager Liz to a future meeting.

STAR Youth Project

Big Local has funded STAR Youth Project £1,000 for the Boxing Club. They are open on Fridays and Saturdays 7-9pm. About 20-30 people attend and it is going very well. They will speak to Carla, Sports Inclusion Officer to open a session for the girls.

World Customer Training

This is a 2 day course for any members if they are interested in attending on Wed/Thurs and is open to ages 16+. An email was sent out with information to all the members.

DBS

If any members would like to have a DBS, to make an appointment with Diane at The Volunteer Centre, Keighley

CLLD

Keighley Big Local is committed to CLLD, providing match funding to allow groups in Keighley East to delivery Partners. Keighley College is the main applicant, communication is poor. The bid will include Jam on Top, Hainworth Wood Community Centre and KBL Youth Work.

Walking Festival

Muppett talked about the Walking Festival. Over 200 people took part in it, with 25 walks over 1 week. 18 organisations were involved. This will be looked to run again next year. The most popular event was at East Riddlesden Hall and delivered by Out in the Aire, a UNLD award winner in Keighley East

Red Box

The Red Box is about period poverty in schools in the Big Local areas. A £50 grant was given to provide Collection boxes in 15 Co-op stores have said they will have red boxes in their stores for people to donate sanitary products. Once collected from all stores/red boxes, these will then be distributed in schools in the Big Local areas.
