KEIGHLEY BIG LOCAL

When the bells tolled at midnight on 31st December 2014 Keighley had 14 month remaining of its 'Pathway' period to secure an opportunity from Local Trust; to drawdown £1Million of funding for the 'Keighley Valley' within the Keighley East Electoral

To secure the funding, Keighley needed to recruit at least 8 residents to form a 'Partnership', consult with the communities of the 'Keighley Valley', produce a community profile and a plan of how residents would want to see the money

Previous attempts to engage with the community had not been as successful as hoped. Effective consultation results in action, but that is the tip of the iceberg. We needed to establish enough agreement and support within our communities that the actions made sense and would work. We knew potential key players were out there, we needed to get them on board, each with a stake in the solution to give it the best chance of succeeding. The best process to identify them, involve them and build up interest was through **Participatory** Budgeting. Participatory budgeting [PB] is a process of democratic deliberation and decision-making where residents decide how to allocate public budgets.

We used the principles of PB to: Raise the profile of Big Local through a grass root presence, ensure engagement, inform the community profile, provide quick fix solutions through £50-100 'on the spot' grants which tested ideas and thinking and recruit residents.

With the assistance of local Ice Cream man- Mr Whippy we set off through the Keighley valley with the offer of a free Ice Cream for a completed survey. The door step 'cone-sultations' were a massive success. 345 residents shared their views, each conversation was recorded and funding offered to residents to action the most popular ideas- providing a quick fix solution. The small projects galvanised small groups of residents who organised activity which tested ideas and acted a precursor to more ambitious thinking. Residents who organised and took part in the activities went on to lead the development of the Vision & Themes of the Big Local Plan in a series of 6 public meetings, form the Partnership and submit the plan to Local Trust.

In January 2015 Keighley secured £1Million of Local Trust funding

KEIGHLEY BIG LOCAL

The Keighley Big Local Plan was endorsed by Local Trust in January 2016. The Plan became live in March 2016 for a period of 2 year.

We had 7 Themes with X projects. We planned, initiated and implemented achievable projects with individual communities: 'Quick fixes' which would help meet the aspirations of residents and broaden participation in the long-term aims of Keighley Big Local.



Rewarding members of the community helped increase participation, build trust, affirm actions and build a sense of being valued and 'community identity' that motivated residents to participate in the long run.

The Surrey Street Rewards Projects saw 28 children, and young people supported by Partnership member Hamm regularly litter pick their local play area. Stickers were credited to individual reward cards which earned 'treats' such as play days, sports, gardening, trips and communal eating. All of which were part organised by residents.

The 'reward' itself became a means of engaging and recruiting more residents and an opportunity for residents and Partnership members to develop their own skills and confidence to deliver activity.

We took advantage of community gatherings, particularly the Halloween events which meant consultation was open and ongoing, making it easier for people to get involved, encouraging input and ideas, with flexibility to feed into the Kelghley Big Local Plan.

KEIGHLEY BIG LOCAL

Although the Keighley Big Local area is blessed with a green open space, adopted, used and managed to varying degrees by residents, there is a lack of accessible buildings residents identify as their own: A lack of community spaces to facilitate the exchange of ideas, friendships and share experiences.

We recognised this in our Pathway year which led to our 'door step' approach to engagement. Building and maintaining relationships in a place residents were familiar with and comfortable in- their doorstep and street corner.

What We Learned: Locality

Conducting research on the doorstep provides opportunity to collect information from residents, but also allows for greater engagement and conversation and a better chance of 'buy-in'.

We found more residents would get involved with actives if it was in a place they knew with people they were familiar with. We knew the outcomes we wanted to achieve and adopted an ABCD approach to getting there; identifying and promoting residents skills, celebrating local knowledge and encouraging them to set their own targets.

At Dalton lane, residents organised more ambitious litter picks involving street play and foods. In Stockbridge residents organised a Sunflower growing competition and river enthusiasts shared river monitoring techniques. Residents in Riverside took it one step further and used a Big Local small grant to buy 20 coffee mugs and every Thursday evening they met out on the street; exchanging garden plants, planning activity and getting know one and other.

In June we started to utilise the HALE Community Bus in neighbourhoods where green space was at a minimum.

KEIGHLEY BIG LOCAL

The first Keighley Big Local Plan had been a success, a PRINCE 2 assessment showed we had delivered 85% of what we had set out to do. We had a thirst for positive change and it was getting easier to be heard, we were getting noticed- including an invite to a private surgery with our constituency MP.

We wanted to be more ambitious, but at the same time we recognised we could not do it all ourselves- it was all about establishing the right partnerships, with the right agreements and realistic contributions to achieve our outcomes.

Our activities to date had been territorial, macro and personal, we were looking to partner up with other organisations to deliver for our communities and also for our communities to have more cross-over and connection: Building social capital.



It was important to show we knew our stuff and we could demonstrate that through sharing local knowledge. How this knowledge is communicated is significant, and by whom, both within and beyond the community.

We learned to do that by serendipity. We started to invite potential applicants for our Community Fund to Partnership meetings, initially as a means of keeping meetings fun and interesting- what happened was a sharing of experiences, practices, cultural differences and ideas between the Partnership and guests which led to more involved and dynamic projects. Partnership meetings were quorate, well attended and led to working agreements with UNLTD, STAR Youth, Bradford Credit Union, Jam on Top Recording Studios and the development of the All for Play agenda. All with written partnership agreements.

KEIGHLEY BIG LOCAL

The Keighley Big Local area is a linear corridor with a busy infrastructure that helps some residents connect with amenities, other communities and places of work and study. But the railways, roads, canals tow paths, rivers and areas of industry has also created a fragmented landscape, psycological with some residents feeling 'community cut off and isolated from others in their communities. This wedge through the Keighley Big Local community limits people's desire to move through that area, reducing accessibility to services, networks and community 'cohesion



Residents living in Red Holt, in the South of Keighley Big Local knew little about what was going on 2 Mile away in Stockbridge, in the North of the area. Residents in Dalton lane and Riddlesden has no connection with our only Community Centre in Hainworth. Prior to Big Local there was little organised activity throughout, so there was no reason to travel.

Promoting meetings throughout Keighley Big Local and encourage members of one neighbourhood to support another started to open up opportunity and knit communities together. In January 2019 we introduced the One Hour Tidy's as a means of encouraging more pride in neighbourhoods but they also quickly became an opportunity for effective meetings; 'on the ground', visible and inclusive to residents and service providers.

We had identified common interests and individuals willing to take forward ideas, but we were also reminded of the importance of 'being seen', giving communities opportunity to cross-over, discuss their ideas together, imagine their ideal community: Leading to organisation, planning and action.



KEIGHLEY BIG LOCAL

At the beginning of 2020 we had a plan; we would concentrate our efforts outdoors, improving and activating parks and encouraging more residents to enjoy our natural green spaces. In March we went into lock-down. 'Doorstep Support' was our response to the COVID action plan for Keighley East. When the government's guidelines came into play, first and foremost we wanted to ensure the food bank run from Hainworth Wood Community Centre continued to operate. The food bank provides for 25-30 people in need each week but the volunteers who run it week-in-week-out were self-isolating apart from one. We knew we could provide more support as the Big Local play team, run by Get Out More CIC, were unable to deliver their weekly Forest Schools activities. With furloughed Keighley Big Local Partnership members we had a consistent team to help each week, providing a visible presence of familiar faces with an offer of practical help. The twice weekly patrols were a massive success. We picked up ideas from residents and quickly established a number of initiatives- provision of essential items, DIY Materials, Street games, competitions and a network of 'good neighbours'. Big Local was the anchor in the community helping to mobilise residents to take action. Like 5 local ladies who collectively became Ma Kelly's Kitchen providing 200 hot meals for shielding and isolating residents. Covid-19 has changed the way Keighley Big Local works and what we have learned will inform what we do in future years. HWCC Online shop, developed through the partnership with Unltd is the perfect management tool for distributing items to those who need them, in a safe organised way. The All for Play team still maintain a link with older residents and have now secured funding to continue Door Step Support activity throughout 2021. And Ma Kelly? What happened to them? They are now a 'Small Charity' and continue to support our residents.





The Salaried Worker will remain in post. To demonstrate our belief projects will be self-sustaining, the salaried worker contract hours will be reduced to 26 hours per week in years 1 & 2; 15 hours in years 3 & 4 and 7.5 hours in the final year.





Legacy

Keighley Big Local Partnership was organised in November 2015, many of those resident who adopted the Terms of Reference and Keighley Big Local Plan were 'raw recruits' with little experience of managing public funding.

Five years on and its been an amazing journey full of great projects. Some have worked, some have 'spluttered' along and some fizzled away but it is agreed they were all worthwhile ways for the partnership to have spent their time: Forest Schools, Wild campsites, Celebrations, Radio Stations, Youth Projects.

But something was missing: What was Keighley Big Locals legacy?

The Partnership wanted to define a legacy which would outlast the Local Trust funded period; something everyone could point to years from now and have more than just memories to show for it; something that had impact on Keighley Big Local people and places

The legacy that will be left by Keighley Big Local will emerge from its achievements, failures and planned activities and some of the Partnership members felt time was running out. One Partnership member said "it really worries me that what we are doing ends up to have no long-term value", another said "funding is finite, are we using it right? Will what we've done inspire people in decades to come?"

On March 10th 2020 the Partnership started a formal journey to evaluate and consider the impact of Keighley Big Local. Meeting in person and using online survey tools they discussed what they had done, what they were doing and what should and should not be done to ensure a legacy.

The Partnership maintain the original Vision and Mission Statement:

A Happy Keighley. A content Place 'Big Local Keighley Valley will give people the power to create communities where everyone of all ages has the chance to live and play, where streets and open spaces are clean, safe and welcoming, with a supportive community which is strong and fair - a community that learns and celebrates together'

A resident led community hub, Big Local Keighley Valley will be the organisation of choice for those people who want to make the area an even better place to live'

And reviewed activity within the 5 themes of the Keighley Big Local Plan 2018-2021, to provide a clear understanding of the action required to give the best chance of creating a Legacy.
