Pete Western gave an introduction and shared his experiences. Pete is starting a new business called Wild Western, He is supported by Missing Peace and a part of the new Parkwood Community group. Pete is also accessing support from the Keighley Big Local Start Up fund along with another Parkwood resident Ruth Owens.

Pete has completed the IPS course with Missing Peace. There is interest from others to do the course so Shaun will provide the Partnership with details and see if it should be made available to Big Local residents.

Sam came to visit us. He is attending university soon and is interested in urban planning, community and how communities use spaces. Sam want to join us for the next meeting

The Parkwood Community Group is now a constituted group and Claire D is the Chair. The group will look at helping improve the park, improve the Parkwood garden and they are talking to Sab about joining forces with Clover Rise residents. The group will also be talking to Keighley town Council about Christmas tree lights on Parkwood Street. There was a community garden clean up at the Parkwood Forest Food Garden on Saturday and Robbie Moore MP was present. The first job is organising the Family Play day.

The Keighley Social Enterprise town meeting is tomorrow. The campaign is going well with a successful "Venturists" project at Riddlesden St Marys and an Enterprise Day planned at Keighley College in November. The group is very close to social enterprise town status for Keighley, supported by Keighley Town Council and the MP. KSET is sponsoring the Social Enterprise of the Year award at the Business awards funded by Unltd/ Big Local.

The next Café Eden support group is on Friday 22nd July at Cliffe Castle café as the college will be closed.

Helen and Discover Tai Chi is working with Manorlands, the online training for health professionals is going well and Discover Tai Chi will be representing Keighley at Big Local Connects in September. Shaun, Claire and Sue will also be there helping to run one of the stalls.

The Keighley Walking Festival takes place on 16th, 17th and 18th September. Walks will be led by Parkwood Community Group, Discover Tai Chi, Missing Peace and Lee Senior. The festival is linking up with 2 other walking groups in the area and Walk Leader training is promoted to Keighley East residents.

Hazel from Get Out More runs activities for children and families and the green spaces are being used more positively. Hazel is delivering 12 hours of face to face activity each week.

The Keighley Film Club has awarded 50 tickets for families who haven't been to the cinemas to go there and watch a film. Keighley Big Local has added a further 30. There are also 40 treat tickets to purchase sweets and drinks. Funded by Kelghley Film Club and Keighley Big Local. Shaun has spoken to Jim Walker and Bob Thorp and most of th tickets will be distributed through the Salvation Army. How do we allocate our tickets to reach the right people.

Shaun is compiling a list of training opportunities Big Local might fund for residents. Ideas from partnership members include Keighley Pride Employee awareness of LGBT issues with Bradford Equity partnership; Food Hygiene for young people with Ma Kelly's, IPS with Missing Peace; Forest Schools level 1 with get Out More. Jo said the food hygiene would fit with Youth Service plans.

The Hainworth wood Wild Campsite is being used and positive feedback from people. There will be an open day in November. A quiz took place and questions from Shaun were all Big Local related.
